In the mornings the pupils had three hours of English speaking lessons, with native speakers used to teaching English to foreigners, there were level groups in which there were different nationalities.

The games were on in the afternoons and they played football, basketball, which was easy. But they also had to play **rounders** or **dodgebal**l, and it was more complicated since some teams **discovered** these British sports while playing. In the evenings they went back to their families by bus and some of them had the opportunity to meet other foreign pupils in their families. Besides they lived in the same area so they enjoyed spending more time together on the beach. We also visited Llandudno and Liverpool together!
