TIPS FOR TEACHING

VOCABULARY

Your students may acquire vocabulary in different ways, consciously or unconsciously but remember that it can take some time before they actually *own* it.

Tip 1 – Have your students develop strategies to...

- understand/get new vocabulary
 - ⇒ Use visual support provide clear, predictable context activate prior knowledge...
- remember/memorize new vocabulary
 - ⇒ Have students match, categorize, classify vocabulary have them reflect on the construction of words have them reflect on the link between written and spoken forms...
- recognize new vocabulary
 - ⇒ Provide extra documents that contain the new vocabulary switch the language focus (reading, speaking, listening, and writing) but not the topic...
- use new vocabulary
 - \Rightarrow Assign communicative tasks that require students to use the new vocabulary over and over again ...

<u>Tip 2</u> — Because your classes contain different types of students use a multi-faceted approach to vocabulary learning.

Have your students use:

- semantic maps
- vocabulary logs
- ...

<u>TIP 3</u> — last but not least, have them play with words and discover the power of rightly-chosen words
